Attitudes and Attire

Attitudes & Attire offers workshops on recognizing personal worth, presenting a positive image, overcoming barriers, and developing self-esteem and work ethics to economically disadvantaged women referred to this agency by over 100 local agencies. NCJW volunteers act as image consultants to help clients select professional clothing and accessories for the workplace. Volunteer once a month for 2 – 2½ hours. Training provided by boutique manager.

Community Board Institute

Community Board Institute (CBI) is a non-profit management and leadership seminar for board members and agency staff of social service agencies and volunteer organizations. This one-day seminar held in April is planned and presented in cooperation with the Center for Nonprofit Management, Junior League, and United Way.

Communications & Public Relations

This committee is responsible for communicating NCJW programs and activities to the public through media access. Volunteers are needed to develop a PR brochure and video to promote the activities of the Section to our members, the general public, corporations, and businesses.

Financial Development

We are already planning this fall's fundraising effort. Included with the non-event will be a raffle and an eBay auction. Various skills needed and time commitment is flexible.

Food + Fit = Fun

This new initiative needs volunteers to help with cooking classes, grocery store tours, and fitness training to ensure that our preschool children and their families stay healthy and fit!

Hannah's Group

For those who dare and desire to delve a bit further into advocacy, this very special "action group" empowers members to be effective advocates.

Hello Israel

Hello Israel is an educational enrichment program for fifth and sixth graders that supplements the regular social studies curriculum. It provides knowledge about Israel - its culture, people, history, geography, economy, and government, ancient and modern - and encourages friendships based on mutual understanding of diverse cultures. Volunteers bring this unique classroom experience to area students. Training is provided.

HIPPY – Grand Prairie, Richardson, Irving, and Dallas ISD's

HIPPY is a parent involvement and school readiness program for three, four, and five-year-old children. This home-based early intervention program trains parents to become their children's first and most influential teachers. Volunteers participate in cultural enrichment field trips as well as special celebratory events for HIPPY families at the end of the school year.

- **Service to Immigrant Families**
 Through its With One Voice coalition, NCJW once again acts as convener and coordinator of various area agencies involved in providing services to the immigrant community.
- **Kids in Court**
 This program assists the Dallas District Attorney's office in preparing children who are potential witnesses in felony child abuse cases. One Saturday morning every other month volunteers assist in making the courtroom and its procedures familiar to these children and their families.
- **Meals on Wheels – JFS and VNA**
 Meals on Wheels provides a hot, nutritious noontime meal and personal contact to disabled, ill, and frail homebound clients. Volunteers deliver meals through Visiting Nurse Association (1st and 4th weeks of the month) and through Jewish Family Service (Kosher meals four times a year).
- **Membership**
 Volunteers are needed to help recruit new members, plan friendly activities to tell people about NCJW, and serve as “buddies” to new members.
- **Morton H. Meyerson Symphony Center Docent Program**
 The Symphony Center, opened in 1989, hosts the Dallas Symphony Orchestra and houses the Herman W. and Amelia H. Lay Family Concert Organ. Volunteer docents provide public and private tours of the Center. Training and docent manual provided.
- **Parkland Hospital Newborn Screening Program**
 Volunteers perform hearing screenings for newborns in Parkland's Continuing Care Nursery. Volunteer once a week for 2 – 3 hours. Training and observation opportunities provided.
- **Programming & Study Groups**
 Volunteers are needed to help plan programs and study groups during the year. Two meetings, two luncheons, and several study groups a year—pick your interest and the time of year that is best for you!
- **Rainbow Room – Community Partners CPS**
 Rainbow Room is an in-house resource center for Child Protective Services. Among its many services, it provides therapy for children and teenagers who have been sexually abused. NCJW volunteers make and pack peanut butter and jelly sandwich sack dinners for child clients who are attending these therapy sessions. Dinners are prepared on a Monday evening. Children of all ages welcome.
- **Vickery Meadow Learning Center**
 Vickery Meadow Learning Center is an adult literacy program, dedicated to improving the communication and life skills of non-English speaking adults so they may function more productively in society. Volunteers teach English as a second language to Vickery Meadow adults one day a week for 2 hours. Training and curricula is provided.
- **Women's Access to Comprehensive Health Services**
 This program, in conjunction with Central Dallas Ministries' TRAC program, provides comprehensive contraception and sexuality education to youth ageing out of foster care, as well as advocacy on behalf of comprehensive, medically accurate, age appropriate sexuality education in Texas public schools.
- **Yearbook**
 This committee organizes the data and sells ads to defray the cost of printing the Yearbook, NCJW's membership directory.
