Deborah Copaken is the *New York Times* bestselling author of several books, including *Shutterbabe, The Red Book*, and *Between Here and April*, among others. A contributing writer at *The Atlantic*, she was also a TV writer on the Golden Globe-nominated *Emily in Paris*, a performer (The Moth, etc.), and an Emmy Award–winning news producer and photojournalist. Her photographs have appeared in *Time*, *Newsweek*, and *The New York Times*.



Her writing has appeared in *The New Yorker, The New York Times, The Guardian, The Financial Times, Observer, The Wall Street Journal, The Nation, Slate, O, the Oprah Magazine*, and *Paris Match*, among others. Her column "When Cupid Is a Prying Journalist" was adapted for the Modern Love streaming series. Her seventh book, *Ladyparts*, a memoir of bodily destruction and resurrection during marital rupture, will be published by Random House on August 3, 2021. She lives in Brooklyn with her family.

OUR MISSION

The National Council of Jewish Women (NCJW) is a grassroots organization of volunteers and advocates who turn progressive ideals into action. Inspired by Jewish values, NCJW strives for social justice by improving the quality of life for women, children, and families and by safeguarding individual rights and freedoms.

Through education, community service, advocacy and collaboration, we work to address the needs of all peoples and faiths within our community. Our advocacy efforts aim to correct the root causes of the social problems we encounter.

OUR HISTORY

In March 1913, the National Council of Jewish Women, Greater Dallas Section, was granted a charter by the national organization and became the first Jewish women's organization in Dallas.

NCJW has launched, maintained and funded numerous community projects to meet needs in the Dallas community during our 100+ years of volunteerism. Here are some highlights:

- First penny lunches in Dallas Public Schools
- First hearing tests and free health physicals for school children
- First Family Outreach counseling families to prevent child abuse and neglect
- Instrumental in starting the Dallas Mental Health Association
- Founded LIFT (Literacy Instruction for Texas) in 1961 (now ASPIRE)
- Founded Dallas CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) in 1979
- Founded Safeguards for Seniors education for seniors regarding medication safety
- Support of numerous community service projects in Israel
- And so many more...

Our volunteers continue to serve many social service agencies in Dallas. With your generous support, NCJW's past and present commitment to improving the lives of women, children, and families will continue to be our impetus in the future!

COVID-19 Impact

Shortly after the beginning of the COVID-19 shutdown and its devastating impact on the health and economy of the area, NCJW Dallas allocated \$100,000 from the SHARE Endowment Fund to help mitigate the virus' impact. Partner agencies applied for and received grants up to \$15,000 to meet COVID-19 related emergency needs in our community.

OUR PROJECTS

FOOD + FIT = FUN

Food + Fit = Fun (FFF) is a bi-lingual, hands-on nutrition and wellness program that provides ways to live a healthier life by eating well, staying active, and having fun.

HIPPY FIELD TRIPS & SCHOLARSHIPS

This project supports the national HIPPY preschool-preparedness program with annual scholarships to college-bound HIPPY graduates as well as with cultural field trips for preschoolers and their families in Irving ISD, Richardson ISD, and Dallas ISD.

WEST DALLAS INITIATIVE

NCJW Dallas' largest project, the West Dallas Initiative consists of many components including ongoing supportive partnerships with:

- * four elementary schools and the regular provision of uniforms, underwear, jackets and shoes to all students as well as NCJW's mentoring Reading Buddies program;
- * the West Dallas Multipurpose Center and the West Dallas Coalition in an annual Back-to-School Fair, Holiday Turkey giveaways and a monthly Clothes Closet.

KIDS IN COURT

This program assists the Dallas District Attorney's office in preparing children who are potential witnesses in felony child abuse cases.

THE SUITCASE PROJECT

"The Suitcase Project" aims to help women and children coming out of domestic violence or trafficking situations meet minimal, modest material needs, and start their new lives with a sense of dignity.

We also partner with other nonprofits who serve the community including JFS, Literacy Achieves, Vickery Meadow Food Pantry, the VNA, Mosaic Family Services, West Dallas Multipurpose Center, CASA, Texas Muslim Women's Foundation, Dallas, Irving and Richardson Independent School Districts and TRACT.
